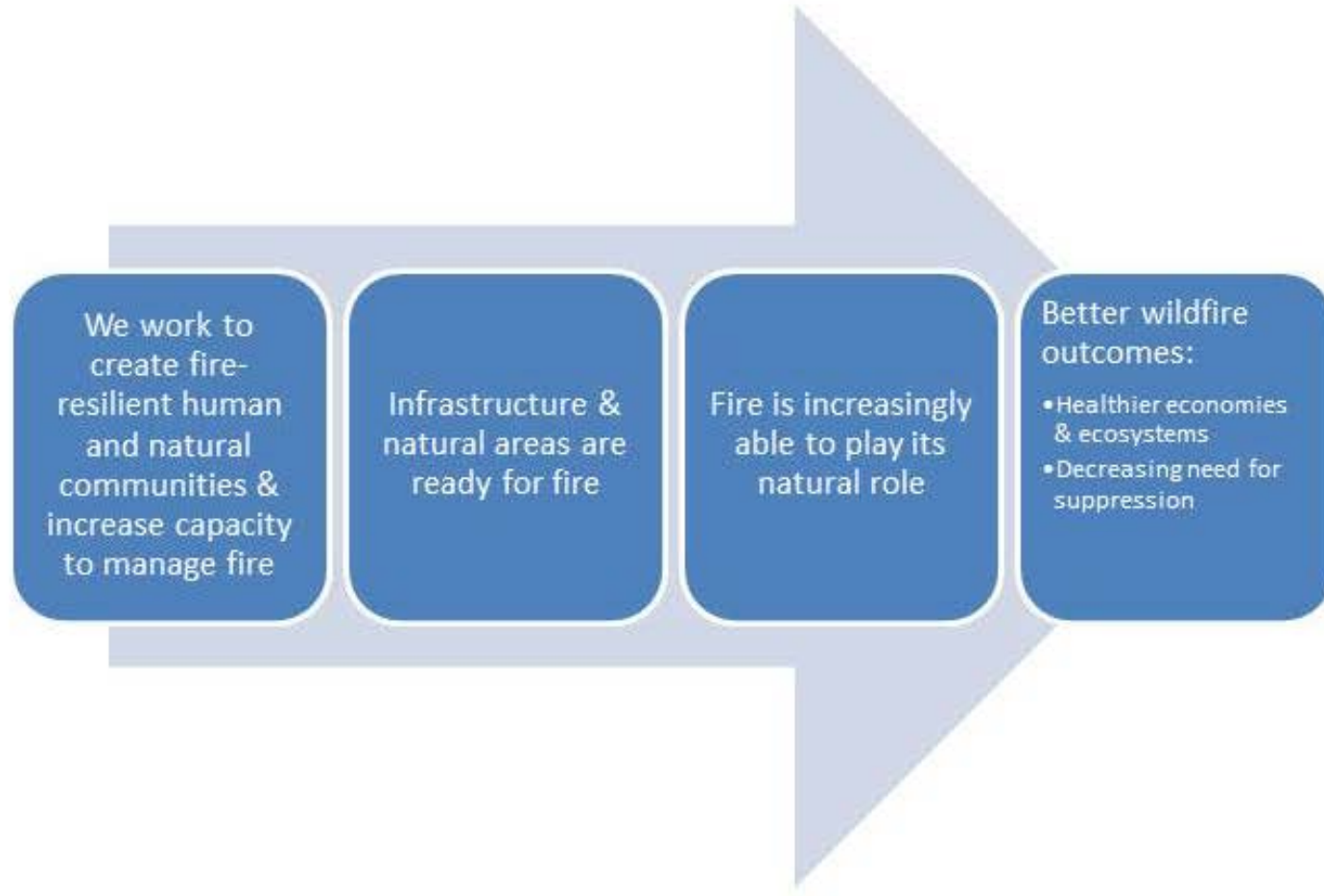

# Since 2002....

The Fire Learning Network helps people work together and increases the capacity needed to help ecosystems and communities become more resilient. The FLN supports public-private landscape partnerships that engage in collaborative planning and implementation, and provides a means for sharing the tools and innovations that help them scale up. As a result, FLN partnerships are able to tap new funding sources, and further increase the scale and pace of their efforts.

# Fire Learning Network (FLN)

Convenes highly successful, integrated collaborative planning efforts; builds trust and understanding; improves local community capacity to live with fire; overcomes planning gridlock and addresses climate change.

At a national level, the FLN provides training that helps fire professionals work with local communities, introduces tools for collaboration in fire planning, builds public support for forest and fire restoration, and helps agencies adopt an “all lands” and science-based approach.
